



Microwave Network to East

Project Description:

Microwave connection is communication network which can be connected by radio waves in some mountains considering the geographical locations the optical fiber will either be not possible or expensive to implement MCIT has decided to use microwave network to connect these provinces to optical fiber network.

This project interconnected Kabul to Major cities in the eastern part of Afghanistan such as Jalalabad, Asadabad, and Mihteram and also to Pakistan via Torkham. It has 13 towers and related radio equipments and antennas in 4 provinces.

Project Benefits:

The project brings land-based connectivity for the eastern provinces and its benefits includes:

- Expand links between Afghanistan and international providers.
- Significantly lower the cost of national and international connections.
- The project allows a significant increase in the volume of national and international traffic and substantially lower the cost of telecommunications to the people of Afghanistan
